Kentucky Harvest

One of the unique aspects of St. Francis High School is its dedication to community service. Students and teachers devote three hours of school every other week to serving the community.

This year's sites give students a chance to work in a variety of settings. Students work with animals at the Kentucky Humane Society and the Louisville Zoo. Those who like children can work at Breckinridge Elementary, Coleridge-Taylor Elementary, Wesley Community Center, or Wayside Christian Missionary. Others at Way-

side work in the kitchen, and volunteers with Kentucky Harvest distribute donated food to shelters and soup kitchens. At the Public Library, Public Radio, and Infant Resource center, volunteers file, sort, and shelve materials. Many work: building houses with Habitat for Humanity or sealing windows with Project Warm. Volunteers also participate in programs which support adults, helping AIDS victims at House of Ruth, or preparing medical information with the Community Health Trust.
